

# 4WD Recreational Track Classification

## How tracks are rated



The Four Wheel Drive Recreational Track Classification System provides a standard four level colour coded system to indicate the degree of difficulty of 4WD tracks and routes. The classification enables visitors to understand the nature of a track before beginning their journey and allows them to plan their trip for enjoyment, safety and comfort.

A number of areas have been classified in **Victoria's State Forest and National Parks** along with Victoria's Iconic 4WD Adventures. **Please note - All tracks are classified in dry conditions and will be more difficult in wet conditions.**



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
## FOREST EXPLORER ONLINE

In addition to Victoria's Iconic 4WD Adventures, in 2009/10 Parks Victoria, the Department of Sustainability and Environment and Four Wheel Drive Victoria, undertook a pilot project in six locations to trial the new track classification system. These classified tracks, as well as the routes for the Iconic 4WD Adventures have been mapped and are viewable (and downloadable) from Forest Explorer Online, an interactive mapping product for viewing online maps of Victoria's public land.

To access Forest Explorer Online visit [www.dse.vic.gov.au](http://www.dse.vic.gov.au) and click on 'Interactive Maps' and then 'Forest Explorer Online'.



You can click layers of information on and off to create the map of most interest to you. Key layers include detailed road info, public land tenure (to find out who manages the land you may be visiting), contours and State forest camping and picnic sites.



Once you have the map view you want, you can add text, draw symbols or add labels to personalise your map. Maps you create can be saved as PDF documents for emailing to friends or printed out. Use it to plan your next trip.
